Funding benefits cultural programs

The Los Angeles Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA) has announced it is investing more than \$3 million in 258 nonprofit arts organizations and festival producers.

Over the next fiscal year through June 30, DCA will award 270 grants to arts service providers to create more than 1,150 public activities, from outdoor festivals and parades to art-and poetry workshops. The programs will feature professional artists and is geared toward everyone from aspiring actors and artists to underserved youth and victims of domestic violence. The grants will also fund hundreds of exhibitions and events at theaters, music venues, performance centers, galleries, museums, schools, hospitals, social service centers and senior centers.

“With this critical funding, DCA supports our nonprofit partners throughout Los Angeles in providing more access to quality arts and cultural activities to people across our great city for free or at a low cost,” said DCA general manager Danielle Brazell.
